- Hong Kong competed at the Commonwealth Games from 1934 until 1994 as a British colony
- Hong Kong has participated in all Summer Olympic Games since the 1952 Games in Helsinki, Finland
- Hong Kong has been participating in the Asian Games since the 1954 Games
- The first appearance of Hong Kong was in 1972 **Summer Paralympics** where ten male athletes took part
- Hong Kong has participated in every East Asian Games since 1993

Hong Kong's international sporting identity after 1997

- Effort of Juan Antonio Samaranch and Chinese government
- Hong Kong's own special identity in the international system
- Individual status ▶ government incentive to invest in sports



HKSI: Government increasing investment in Elite Sports




Figure 1: Trend of Elite Training Grant Increase from 2014/15 to 2024/25





Figure 2: Trend of Sports Expenditure Budget from 2021/22 to 2024/25

Hong Kong three-pronged approach to promote sports (2002-2021) - Promoting sports in the community



- encourage the public to participate in various types of sports activities
- develop a strong sporting culture in the community, helping them develop a healthy lifestyle
 - Promotion of sports in the community accounted for a majority of the Government's recurrent expenditure on sports development
- In 2023-24, about \$6 billion or 81% of our recurrent expenditure on sports development has been used to promote sports in the community.

Hong Kong three-pronged approach to promote sports (2002-2021) - Supporting elite sports

- The Hong Kong Sports Institute (HKSI) was established in April 1991 as the delivery agent of the Government's elite sports training system
- Government established the Elite Athletes Development Fund in 2012 with an injection of \$7 billion, and a further injection of \$6 billion in 2018-19, to provide a stable financial source for the HKSI to support the development of elite sports





Hong Kong three-pronged approach to promote sports (2002-2021) - Promoting Hong Kong as a centre for major international sports events

"M" Mark System was launched in November 2004, with the aim to gain greater participation and support from the commercial sector as well as the community for the hosting of major international sports events, in order to nurture more sustainable major international sports events in Hong Kong

A Corporate Governance Review was conducted upon the Member Associations of Sports Federation and Olympic Committee of Hong Kong, China ('SF&OC') between December 2020 and September 2023



Code of Governance

6 Chapters:

- Board Governance
- integrity management
- selection of athletes
- management of coaches and umpires
- administration of membership
- general administration

Designed to be adaptable to the diverse needs and sizes of NSA, enabling them to adopt practices that align with their specific contexts while upholding the fundamental principles of good governance

By adhering to the Code of Governance, the NSA can:

- 4. nurture sports talent in Hong Kong


A fund to enhance the competitiveness of athletes since 2021

- Jockey Club Charities Trust finance jointly the setting up of a \$300 million special fund to enhance the competitiveness of athletes at international events since 2021
- The fund will be used to conduct research in sports science and sports medicine, improve athletes' gear, purchase extra equipment for the Scientific Conditioning Centre and the Sports Medicine Centre in the HKSI and more, benefiting elite athletes including athletes with disabilities

Meanwhile, the HKSI continue to provide targeted support and competition preparation plans for athletes, and enhance training to raise the levels of sports science and sports medicine of its teams


